Sovereignty Speaks® OSU Treaty Database announced at White House Tribal Nations Summit



The OSU Library partnered with the United States Department of Agriculture and the Department of the Interior to create the "Tribal Treaties Database." The project was publicly announced at the White House Tribal Nations Summit. Under the direction of Library Dean Shiela Johnson, Juliana Nykolaiszyn, Head, Digital Resources and Discovery Services, and Nina Thorton, Multimedia Producer created a video overview of the project. The video was played at the Tribal Nations Summit, and Founding OSU Center for Sovereign Nations Director Elizabeth Payne was honored to participate in the video.

The new "Tribal Treaties Database" is a free public resource available at treaties.okstate.edu. The project focuses on U.S. government treaties with Native Americans from 1778-1883.
